We have cash rebates and other resources to help you:

- to move from an uncertified wood burning appliance to a qualified appliance
- to move from an old EPA certification to a 2021 EPA certification
- to upgrade or install a cleaner, more efficient eligible forms of heat
- to build a woodshed
- to find, harvest, season and store your wood
- to be aware of poor air quality alerts, venting indexes or bylaw or burning notices
- to build a cheap home air filter
- to buy, install, use or understand air quality sensors and readings
- to understand the health effects of poor air quality or your personal exposure

General Information:

- 1. Refunds are limited, first come, first serve.
- 2. Only 1 rebate per household, within the BVLD AMS service area.
- 3. Installations use WETT principles and follow Provincial or Municipal regulations.
- 4. We need a completed voucher or rebate form (page 5) including survey questions.
- 5. Learn ways to minimize negative health impacts from wood-burning with an <u>online wood smoke</u> education course
- 6. Learn more tips on how to operate wood stoves, season wood and more from <u>PG AIR on</u> youtube
- 7. Check out our blog for local news and updates on air quality.

6 Rebate Types Available:

1. Wood Burning Appliances: For removal of wood burning appliances that are non EPA ceritifed or Not EPA current.

- This old unit must be recycled or decommissioned, some rules apply. Look at the ToDo chart.
- The new unit must meet current EPA standards and be installed.
- Pictures of the old and new units may be required.
- The list of qualified new units and their cash rebate value is:

2. Heat Pump Rebate: For Buildings that have a current EPA certified wood burning appliance and are adding a Heat Pump:

- Installing a new electric heat pump as a primary heating source means you can keep an existing EPA or CSA-certified wood stove to use as backup heating under certain conditions.
- The value of this rebate is the same as the above: \$2000 in the BVLD, \$3000 on Reserves.
- If you are keeping your wood burning appliance as back up please complete the voucher and sign the Pledge! (page 5-7)

3. Boiler Replacement:

- If you are replacing an existing outdoor wood or pellet boiler with a more efficient version you can qualify for a rebate of \$750.00.
- There is no rebate to purchase or install a boiler if you don't already have one.



4. Wood Shed Fund:

- \$250 cashback per residence, after the renovation.
- Please provide a before and after picture.
- Please allow us to use pictures on social media or elsewhere.
- Provide us with an invoice for firewood, materials, time and/or equipment.

5. Added incentives:

- Our incentives can be used in conjunction with other incentives or rebates.

Steps
- contact coordinator@cleanairplan.ca - get the voucher - tell us your plans so we can screen your request and give you an idea of the rebate value
Shop: - ask about manufacturer or retailer discounts - make sure the EPA ceritification is current - arranges building permits if necessary -Complete Section 1 in the voucher.
Disposal: - arrange disposal of old stove to a dealer or recycler - if disposing it yourself - decommission that stove first. These stoves are not meant to be reused or salvaged. 1) removal the door 2) slam the flue collar 3) send us a pic - Complete Part 3 of the voucher.
Install: - the order of these steps does not matter follow WETT principles or use WETT installers - Complete Part 2 of the voucher.
Submit application: Make the pledge - this is optional. Complete the Survey and send it all in.
We will email you to confirm receipt of the voucher but please be patient processing your cheque may take some time.
Cash your Cheque

Did you know...

- the Building Permit Fee is waived in the Town of Smithers, value \$35
- building inspections in Smithers are no longer necessary if the appliance is Wood Energy Tech. Training, WETT inspected
- the Bulkley Valley Credit Union, BVCU still has zero interest loans for purchasing EPA certified appliances
- there are no landfill or recycling depot fees at any location in the airshed
- the BVLDAMS is a non profit society, responsible for implementing the <u>Clean Air</u> <u>Plan</u> of 2012 signed by Bulkley Valley and Lakes District stakeholders in clean air. Membership is free!
