  - discussion points could include what was learned from evaluation of alternatives to burn, ie chipping, incinerating, Hugelkultur, best practices

# 4. Smithers Purple Air Presentation from Vickie Irish, MOE:

- the Shared Agreement for setting up PM sensors in Smithers resulted in 17 sensors in Smithers for the period of 2022 - 2023, MOE - 4, ECCC 2, BVLD AMS 5, Town of Smithers 3, RDBN 2, Private 1. This was a 2 year project ending in 2023. We will have to discuss the future of these sensors.

- Vickie's report focuses on relative differences between sensors rather than absolutes, these sensors can not detect source apportionment.

- there is an obvious high winter variability spatially and temporally.

- the report will be released to the public after Ministry review, Directors will receive a copy prior to this.

- Directors believe that Willowvale is served by natural gas and as it is not affected as much by PIR emissions it's interesting to note it's readings.

## 5. What Matters In Our Valley and Telkwa Coal Discussion:

- Bathurst Resources
  - well financed proponent
  - pushed with a greater degree
  - new EA Law requiring community consultation, the EA's idea of this includes discussion with WMIOV and they have not committed to consulting with anyone else combine this request with a workshop on findings
  - their impact assessment does not focus on air, the regional information is missing
  - what is the nature of the PM?
  - what about the nuisance impacts, blowing dust for example
  - how far does the dust travel?
- what information is missing from the EA, who are some experts that can look at this data? Has the group contacted private firms like RDI, the NGO Climate Action Network Int'l? Folks in New Zealand?
  - AI\*\*Sue to forward Jay some contact's info. (including Barb Oake, Watershed Sentinel, Norm Zirnheldt) - what was the comment about Norm from Sybille?
  - Al\*\*Vickie to forward Jay contact info for her UBC and Cambridge professors
- From Feb Sept there is an EAO assessment period, during this time there will be:
  - a public open house
  - a draft assessment report released

- a 30 day public comment period
- at the end of this 150 days there will be a final report
- Comments that Telkwa Coal considered a 3% increase in PM levels in Telkwa to be insignificant consider Telkwa already exceeds the Provincial recommended 24 hour average
  - AI\*\*Vickie was going to ask the MOE office whether this is the position of the Ministry
- 5. General Updates and Discussion:

1. CWSRP status update: \$8000 in rebate money granted from the Ministry of the Environment and BC Lung Association. No money toward fees or contractor: all \$8000 is to go toward exchange or bounties.

a future program considerations:

- Making an inventory of homes with noticeably smoky woodstoves or fireplaces, and making home visits. Explain the health and economic improvements of burning cleaner, explain the rebates available and give them a copy of the rebate application form.
- 2. Coffee Roasting as a source of emissions

- Catalytic converters for coffee roasters cost roughly \$20k, what about rebates for this, will the Province ever switch gears and offer rebates to small business?
